

**KADIR HAS UNIVERSITY**  
**REGULATIONS FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF FOREIGN STUDENTS**  
**INTO UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS**

**PART I**

**Aims, Scope, Legality, Terms**

**Aims**

**Article 1** – The aim of these regulations is to state the terms of acceptance for students coming from abroad into associate and bachelor degree programs of study at Kadir Has University.

**Scope**

**Article 2** – These regulations stipulate the conditions for class quotas, applications, acceptance and evaluation as regards students coming from abroad.

**Legality**

**Article 3** – These regulations have been prepared in compliance with Article 14 of Law 2547 of the Higher Education Law.

**Definitions**

**Article 4** – In these regulations, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a) Unit: Faculties, schools or vocational schools under the auspices of Kadir Has University,
- b) Board of Trustees: Kadir Has University Board of Trustees,
- c) Student Affairs Office: Kadir Has University Student Affairs Office.
- d) Rector: Kadir Has University Rector.
- e) Senate: Kadir Has University Senate.
- f) Office of International Education: Kadir Has University Office of International Education.
- g) University: Kadir Has University.

**PART II**

**Principles Concerning the Acceptance of  
Students Coming from Abroad**

**Quotas**

**Article 5** – (1) The number of students to be accepted into each associate and bachelor degree program shall be determined by the Senate. This number cannot exceed 50% of the program quotas announced in the *OSYS* (Student Selection and Placement Exam) Higher Education Programs and Quotas Handbook and must be approved by the Council of Higher Education.

## **Conditions for Applying**

**Article 6** – Students may apply if they are studying in their final year of high school or have graduated from high school.

(2) Applications which are compatible with the terms of the Council of Higher Education’s “Regulation for the Acceptance of Students Coming from Abroad” regarding nationality and educational background are accepted.

(3) Explanations on applications are announced on the University website.

## **Accepted Exams and Base Scores**

**Article 7** – (1) The national and international exam or diploma types and scores are indicated in the table below. The applications of individuals who hold these indicated exam scores or diplomas will be considered for acceptance.

(2) Applications from individuals who do not hold the exam results or diplomas indicated in the table below but who received a graduation score of 60% or higher will be considered.

(3) The University Senate reserves the right to append additional exam and diploma types and acceptance criteria to the exams and diploma types stipulated in this article.

(4) Exams which are deemed to be high school graduation exams (Abitur, International Baccalaureate, GCE, Tawjihi, etc.) are always valid and do not expire. Exams which are deemed to be university entrance exams (ÖSS=YGS/LYS, SAT, GAOKAO, the Kazakhstan State University Exam, etc.) are only valid for 2 years.

(5) The national and international exam or diploma types and scores are indicated in Appendix 1 of this Regulation.

## **Application**

**Article 8** – Candidates must fill the application form on the University website and apply to the Office of International Education by the deadline announced on the academic calendar submitting the required documents by e-mail.

## **Documents Required for Application**

**Article 9** – (1) Applicants need to submit the following documents for application. If the documents are in a language other than English or Turkish, approved translations must be submitted together with the originals.

- a) Application form for students coming from abroad
- b) For high school graduates, certified copy of the high school diploma (students who are nearing graduation must submit a transcript)
- c) An approved copy of exam results
- d) Official transcript: Applicants must submit their high school transcripts, which indicate the courses taken and grades received in high school, and this must be approved by the high school directorate
- e) Copy of Turkish and/or English proficiency document (if applicable)
- f) Photocopy of passport pages that show photo and identity information
- g) 2 passport photos

(2) Additional documents might be required due to changes in regulations as well as the Council of Higher Education's "Regulation for the Acceptance of Students Coming from Abroad."

### **Evaluation of applications and acceptance**

**Article 10** – (1) Evaluation and acceptance of applications are made by the recommendation of the Office of International Education, the recommendation of the related department and the approval of the assistant rector in charge of student affairs.

(2) Meeting the minimum application criteria does not guarantee acceptance. In addition to the applicants' exam scores, high school GPA, documentation of awards, and early application are also taken into consideration. Acceptance, placement and fulfilment of quotas are all under the university's authority.

(3) Applications for departments which admit students based on a fine arts skills exam shall be evaluated according to the regulations of admission based on this exam.

(4) Applicants who apply in the spring semester for quotas for the following year may be issued a "prospective acceptance letter" or an equivalent document on the condition that they meet the requirements and that the number of such students does not exceed one third of the quota declared in the handbook of the previous year.

### **Announcement of Results**

**Article 11** – (1) Accepted applicants get notified with an e-mail sent to the e-mail address indicated on their application. An acceptance letter will be sent to accepted students so that they can apply for a visa.

### **Visa**

**Article 12** – (1) The University follows the Law on Foreigners and International Protection dated 4.4.2013 and numbered 6458.

### **Registration and Documents Required for Registration**

**Article 13** – (1) Students who are accepted must register personally within the specified dates; registration shall be done at the Student Affairs Office, and includes submission of the required documents.

(2) During registration, the following documents must be submitted. If the documents are in another language than Turkish, their approved translations must be submitted together with the originals.

- (a) Original of the high school diploma or temporary graduation certificate
- (b) Original letter of equivalence obtained from the Turkish Ministry of Education which states that the high school diploma is equivalent to one received from a Turkish high school
- (c) Original transcript
- (d) Original of the exam score
- (d) Photocopy of official identity card and passport pages that show identity information.
- (e) Photocopy of the official ID or passport pages that show identity information

- (f) Valid document stating that the student meets the nationality and education requirements of the Council of Higher Education's "Regulation for the Acceptance of Students Coming from Abroad"
- (g) Original of Turkish and/or English proficiency document
- (h) Bank receipt indicating that the tuition fee has been paid
- (i) Applicants must demonstrate that they have the economic means to pursue higher education in Turkey
- (j) Three passport photos

### **Tuition fee and financial assurance**

**Article 14** – (1) Education at the university is subject to a tuition fee. The fee for each academic year is not calculated based on the number of courses or semesters but is calculated for the standard duration of education during fall and spring and is specified by the Board of Trustees every academic year.

(2) The amount of economic means to must be demonstrated by applicants is specified every year.

### **English proficiency**

**Article 15** – (1) Individuals studying at undergraduate programs where the language of instruction is English (English or a combination of Turkish and English) must demonstrate the required level of English language skills.

(2) Students must provide documentation indicating that they have received the required English language proficiency score from an exam whose equivalence is accepted and whose validity period is in line with that specified by the Senate. Scores for these exams must be valid according to the terms stipulated by the Senate. The exam centers where these exams are taken must also be approved by the Senate. Students must submit documentation of their English-language skills during the application process in order to start their undergraduate studies. Students who do not provide an internationally valid language proficiency document must take the English proficiency exam of the University and in order to start their undergraduate studies they must receive the required score from this exam as stipulated by the Senate.

(3) Documentation of language proficiency is not requested from students who studied, at least for the last three years, in countries where English is the native language, provided that they studied at schools to which citizens of these countries attend, and that they completed their secondary education at these schools.

(4) Students who do not provide an internationally valid language proficiency document or have not taken or have failed the English proficiency exam of the University, or who do not meet the exemption criteria in the third article must attend the English preparatory program of the University.

(5) The Senate specifies other terms that can be accepted as grounds for exemption from the English Preparatory Program.

(6) The terms indicated above also apply to students who have transferred or changed majors and begun studies at faculties in which the language of instruction is fully or partially English (a combination of Turkish and English).

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## **Turkish proficiency**

**Article 16** – (1) The language of instruction is English or English and Turkish at faculties and Turkish at the schools and vocational schools of the University.

(2) The Turkish language skills of applicants who do not hold a certificate indicating their level of proficiency and who will study in programs conducted in Turkish (or in Turkish and English) are evaluated according to the score received on the university’s Turkish language exam. The ratings are:

–Level A: The applicant’s Turkish language skills are sufficient. He/she can begin courses.

–Level B: The applicant’s Turkish language skills are such that they will improve within a short period of time. He/she must continue Turkish language education during his/her studies.

–Level C: The applicant’s Turkish language skills are not sufficient. He/she can start programs conducted in English but during the course of studies must improve his/her Turkish language skills. He/she may not start programs in which the language of instruction is Turkish. Before beginning studies, he/she must study Turkish for a period of one year, during which time they will be considered to be on approved leave.

(3) Documentation of language proficiency is not requested from students who have studied at least for three years in a Turkish-speaking country at a secondary school along with citizens of that country and have graduated from that school.

(4) Students who have taken the Turkish proficiency exams of TÖMER or the Yunus Emre Institute and received scores indicated in the table below, as utilized in the Common European Framework, are subject to Clause 2 of this article:

Kadir Has University’s Turkish language proficiency levels in comparison with Common European Framework levels:

A	C1	Sufficient Turkish language skills
B	B2-B1	Has the potential to acquire sufficient Turkish language skills within in a short period of time
C	A2-A1	Insufficient Turkish language skills

## **PART III**

### **Final Provisions**

#### **Cases with no provisions**

**Article 17** – (1) If cases should arise for which there are no provisions in these regulations, then recourse must be made to Kadir Has University Regulations for Associate and Undergraduate Degree Programs and other related regulations.

#### **Void regulations**

**Article 18** – (1) The regulations entitled “Kadir Has University Regulations Concerning the Application and Admission of Foreign Students” dated the 10th of April 2013 and numbered 2013/07 are hereby null and void.

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**Date of Implementation**

**Article 19** - (1) These regulations go into effect as of the date they were approved by the Kadir Has University Senate on June 20th, 2016.

**Execution**

**Article 20** - (1) The legal provisions of these regulations are executed by the Rector of Kadir Has University.

*This text is a translation of the original Turkish regulation, and is solely intended to provide information concerning that regulation. The terms, conditions and stipulations in the original Turkish-language regulation shall be legally binding if any disputes of meaning should arise.*
